For Your Children



Children are a vital part of our church family.

Invitation to the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper, which is also called Communion or the Eucharist, was instituted by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The purpose of this sign is to confirm God's covenant promises to His people and feed them spiritually by faith. It is a family meal of Christians, and so anyone who has believed the good news of the gospel, has repented of their sins, and is seeking to follow Jesus as a baptized member in good standing in the Lord's Church is invited to come to this table and to partake of this sacrament.

Instructions for Taking the Lord's Supper at GCC

The sacrament will be distributed by each row coming forward down the middle aisle. One usher will give you a piece of bread to eat, and another usher will give you a cup of wine or grape juice. All of our bread is gluten free. Please be aware that the cups on the outer rings of the communion trays contain wine, and the inside rings contain non-alcoholic grape juice. After finishing the wine or grape juice, please leave your cup in the provided basket and return to your seats down the outer aisle.

If you are not a follower of Jesus Christ, or if you find yourself unprepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and thoughtful reflection. To that end, we have provided the following prayers.

A Prayer for Those Searching for Truth

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might understand the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

A Prayer for Awakening

Lord Jesus, I have heard teaching from the Bible for years, and have been in the church for years, but very little of this seems real to me. Please show me the reality of what you are saying. Unnerve me with the badness of the bad news. Enthrall me with the goodness of the good news. Make what is familiar seem new. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life to me. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.
